# Friends Lend Ongoing Support to Schenectady STARS Program

Much of the City of Schenectady is a book desert and school district literacy scores reflect the local literacy crisis. Tackling that crisis, STARS (Schenectady Takes Action for Reading Success) was formed in 2017. As of the end of 2023, STARS has placed more than 16,000 new, diverse, and developmentally appropriate books into the hands of young children and families across the city and improved access to early literacy support.

STARS is spearheaded by Schenectady County Public Library and partners with many local nonprofit, educational, health, and government agencies to address this critical need.

Since 2022, the Friends of SCPL has donated \$8,000 to STARS through the annual children's supply fund. That donation, coupled with book donations, has enabled STARS to distribute the significant number of books. Furthermore, the STARS steering committee is able to leverage Friends' donated funds to receive additional grant support. In 2023, STARS received funding from major donors including 1st National Bank of Scotia, MVP, and The Schenectady Foundation. Current STARS initiatives include Books for Babies at Bellevue, where every newborn receives a new baby

book and literacy tips for parents. STARS free book shelves are located at the local WIC office, SiCM food pantry, Office of Children & Family Services waiting room, and Parson's Early Learning Center. In November 2023, Park Place Pediatrics became a STARS distribution partner bringing the total number of STARS free book locations to seven. Growing the number of STARS shelves at pediatricians' offices and parent education are priority initiatives in 2024. STARS continually receives donations through its website www.schenectadystars.org.

#### JUNIOR FRIENDS BOOK DRIVE AT NISKAYUNA HIGH SCHOOL

Jesse Angrist and Amelie Knox, seniors at Niskayuna High School and members of the Junior Friends of Schenectady County Public Library, recently orchestrated a book drive at their school, seeking donations of children's and young adult titles. Using social media and print promotional material, the effort ran for two weeks. They collected 130 books, far exceeding their expectations. Books will be sold at A Second Look and Whitney Book Corner.

Jesse (below, left) is participating in a senior year internship program at Niskayuna High School, for which he wanted to work with the Friends because of his interest in library science and linguistics.

Amelie (below, right) is developing social media accounts for the Junior Friends, an important initiative to expand the program's interest to students and increase membership.

This is a great way to get the required volunteer hours needed for many school groups or organizations and a chance to connect with other teens. Junior Friends volunteers will help with library and bookstore special events, book sales, and work in our two bookstore locations.

Within the chapel is a loft that they are actively converting into a small library and quiet reading area. The ultimate goal is to create a usable space for residents.




#### 2024 ADULT WINTER READING CHALLENGE


