A Second Look Celebrates 5-Year Anniversary

A Second Look, a bookstore that started as a sixmonth experiment, celebrated 5 years in business this winter.

Early in 2018, Madelyn Thorne told me that Via Port Rotterdam was looking for some non-profits

to fill their storefronts. Jamie Williams-Peterson, a Friend who worked at a store in the mall, and I met with Terri, the mall manager. She showed us an empty men's clothing store. It wasn't ideal, but the price was right, so we figured we could find used bookcases and make the space work.

In September, I brought the idea to the board of directors.

who had some reservations. At the October meeting, the board agreed to a 6-month trial if we could staff the store.

Robin Eddy and I met with Terri to look for a more suitable place. Terri suggested that we look at the former GNC store that had been vacated a week earlier. It was ideal, with shelves already lining the walls and a location close to an outside entrance.

We signed a six-month lease for January 1, 2019, and set about cleaning, setting shelves, and transporting books. We had a soft opening on Tuesday, February 12, 2019, and our Grand Opening on February 19.

Like all retailers. A Second Look had to close for

COVID restrictions in 2020. Fortunately, we weathered the closure, the store reopened, and we eventually expanded to being open seven days a week.

Today, A Second Look is busy and successful, attracting shoppers to the mall. School vacation weeks are especially busy.

We held a 5-Year Anniversary Celebration the week of

February 26 with giveaways, raffles, and special sales. Our mall neighbors at Via Aquarium donated admission passes.

Thank you to all who support our stores, and congratulations to an amazing five years for A Second

Look.



OUTREACH PROGRAMS FINDING SUCCESS THIS SPRING

The Friends' outreach expansions continue to make headway as spring approaches its bloom.

Friends Scholarship Award

The eight Schenectady County schools are in the process of selecting their recipients for the Friends

Scholarship Award; the first scholarship will be awarded May 22 to a Duanesburg Public School student. On June 7, a student at Scotia-Glenville will receive their award. The Friends are reaching out to the schools' principals to provide presenters with information about the Fund's goals and to gauge interest in a Friends presence among the ceremony attendees.

Bridges of Schenectady

Several seasonal programs are wrapping up after successful runs. The Friends of the Library and Bridges of Schenectady concluded their coat drive after providing numerous coats to people in need, following a sizable turnout of donors, who each received a book in return for their donation.

Internships

The Friends also congratulate their Junior Friends intern, who fulfilled all internship duties and responsibilities with excellence.

After completing an internal audit of preparedness, the Friends of the Library have determined that moving forward with the Big Picture Internship at this moment would not provide the intern and the library with a mutually enriching experience. The Friends will work toward developing a set of policies and procedures for

accepting interns to be better prepared for similar projects in the future.

Building Libraries through Outreach

The Building Libraries through Outreach program has continued to reach local nursing homes, hospitals,

and other organizations. Ellis Medicine's "Comfort Cart," a mobile book cart providing books to patients and their visitors, has been marked a "booming success." After its donations reached over a dozen patients and families, the book cart has been replenished with a second load of paperbacks. Sunnyview Rehabilitation Hospital has also welcomed two loads of books for their library. This month, volunteers are reaching out both remotely and through on-site visits to establish contact with several other local organizations.

Behind the scenes, Friends volunteers are working diligently to source and transport books for our various bookstores and donation sites, create inroads with other local literacy programs, and develop a design for a promotional Friends of the Library bookmark to include with book donations. With all of this and the upcoming book sale on May 4 and 5, this coming month is shaping up to be a big one for the Friends of the Library. 
